BACKGROUND

The (NIHR) national Institute for Health and Research; Global Health Unit on the Prevention and Management of Stillbirths and Neonatal Deaths in Sub-Saharan Africa and South Asia, led from the Centre for Childbirth, Women's and Newborn Health at Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine UK, is an established equitable multidisciplinary partnership between Africa, Asia and UK-based researchers. The centre collaborates with CUHAS- Bugando Tanzania. Our ultimate goal is to end preventable stillbirths and new- born deaths, ensure adequate support for parents and families whose baby dies and reduce associated stigma in Tanzania.

JOB DESCRIPTION

The **Research Assistant** will work on a project related to stillbirth and neonatal death. Antenatal care (ANC) provides health promotion, screening and diagnosis, prevention of complications and promotes positive childbirth experiences through the support of women, partners, families, and communities. The Every Newborn collaboration, launched new 2025 measurable targets, marking the next step in the global effort to end preventable stillbirths and newborn deaths. One of these targets is that every woman should have four or more antenatal contacts. In Tanzania, most women attend one ANC visit (98%); only half (51%) attend four or more. Urban





women are more likely than rural women to have four or more ANC visits and to seek care early in pregnancy, contributing to high intrapartum transfer rates (11%) and an unacceptable stillbirth rate (22.4 per 1000 births). The majority of stillbirths occur in younger first-time mothers (30%), to women living in rural areas (78%) and to women in the lowest wealth quintile (40%). Tanzanian women experience significant challenges attending ANC including lack of partner support, unwelcoming clinic environments, disrespectful care, perceived poor quality of care, socio-cultural beliefs, fear of HIV testing, poverty and distance from health clinics. Women's uptake of ANC services is influenced by good quality and respectful care, building trusting relationships with healthcare workers, continuity of care and flexible clinic appointments.

The focus of the Research Assistant's work will be on ensuring that the project objectives are met. This will include a range of activities including gaining ethical approvals, recruitment and data collection, contributing to data analysis, data management, providing progress reports and liaising with stakeholders, Community Engagement and Involvement (CEI) groups and the wider team. Additional research activities may also be required, according to the needs of the project.
